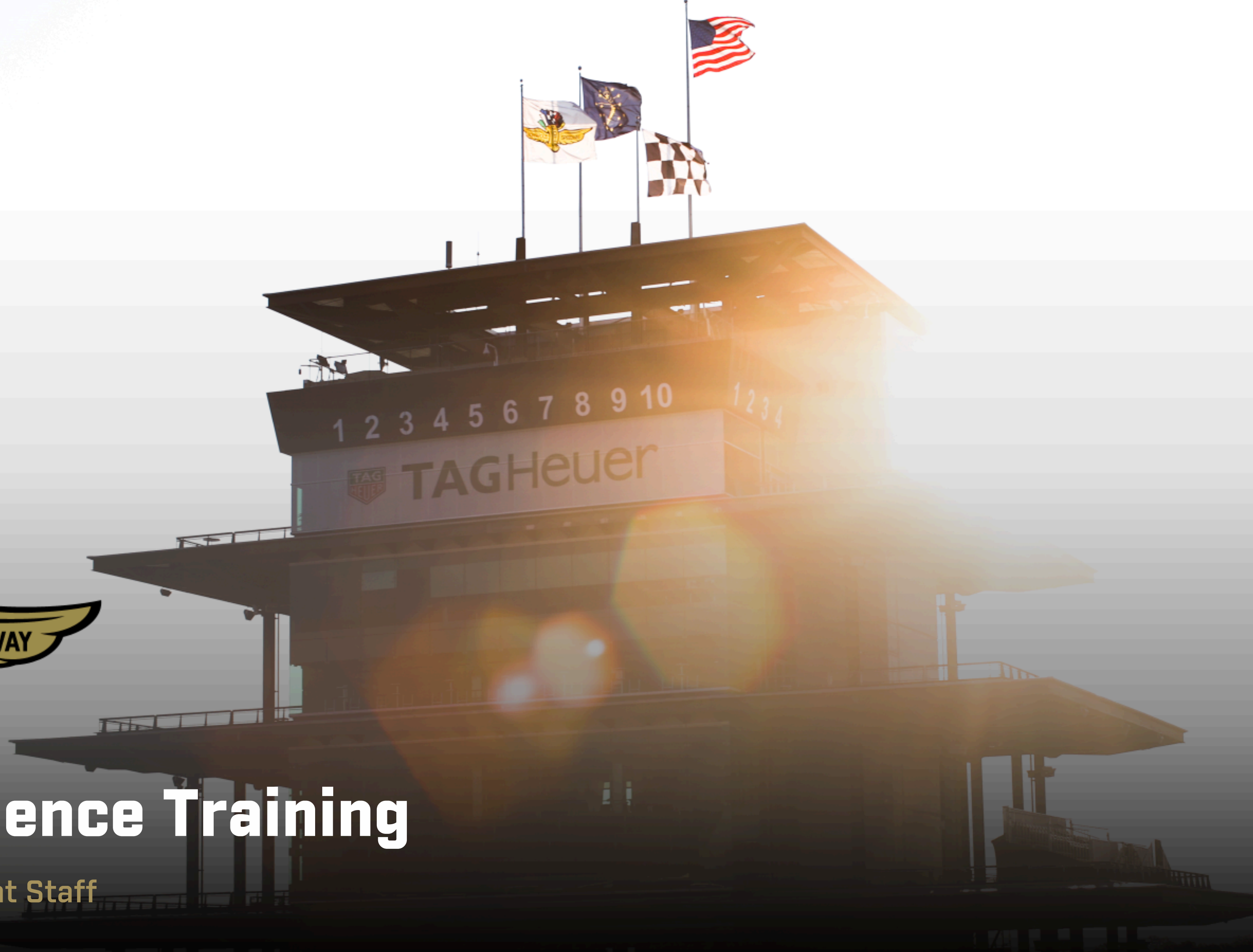

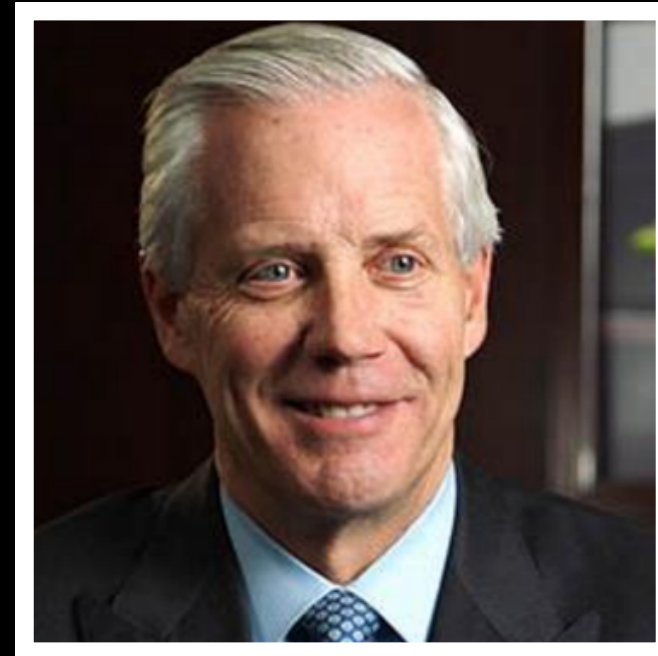
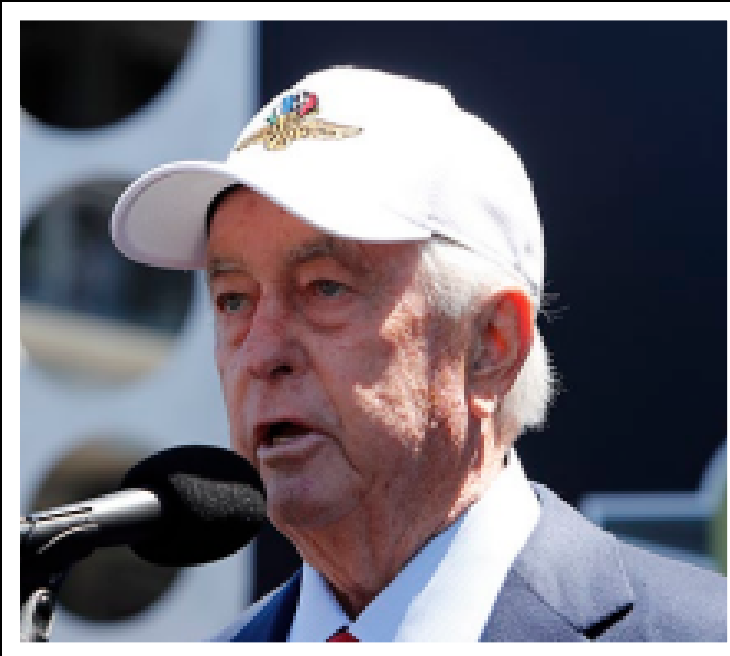
What is Penske Entertainment Corp?

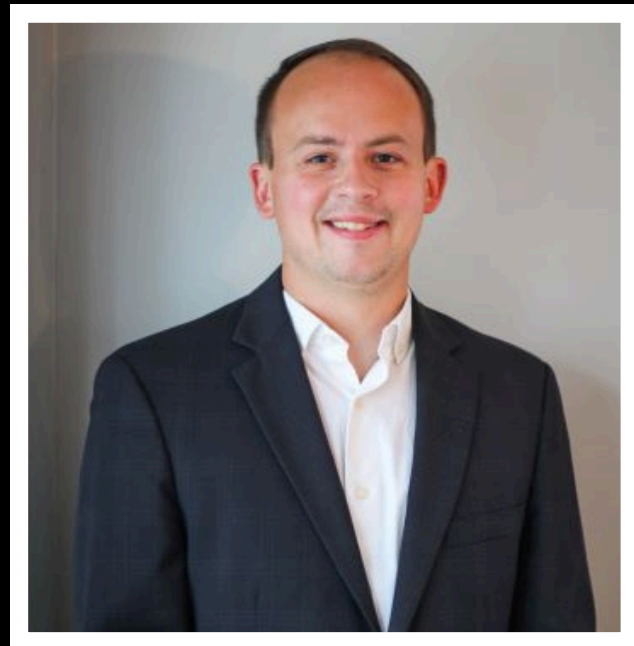

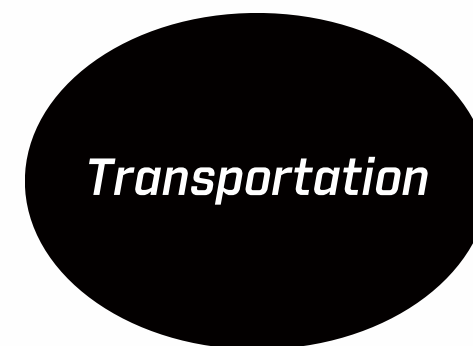
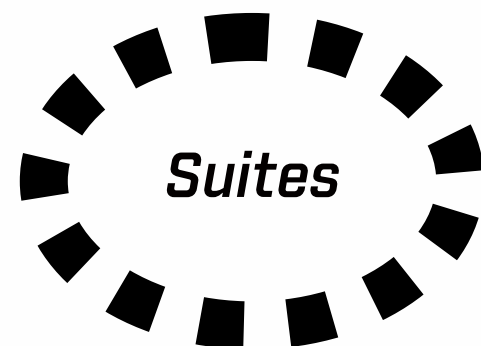


- **Client Services**
 - *Assists our premium guests in gaining access to the venue and attending to their needs while on site.*
- **Credentials**
 - *Assists guests in gaining access to the venue by distributing credentials.*
- **Guest Experience**
 - *Provide support to the GE department by working in one of the following areas: Traffic, Gates, Garage & Pits, Suites, and Transportation.*
- **Sustainability**
 - *Work to support recycling operations, collect food donations, and manage composting as part of ongoing waste diversion efforts.*
- **Tickets**
 - *Provide support to the ticket department activities for our events.*
- **Photo Retail**
 - *Assist customers interested in purchasing photos from the IMS Official Photo Shop.*



GUEST EXPERIENCE

Divisions



Gates: welcome guests into the facility by selling or scanning tickets.

Traffic: direct vehicular and guest traffic and park cars inside the facility.

Suites: enforce credentials and tickets around the premium areas.

Garage & Pits: work in race-related areas and perform credential checks, wayfinding assistance, and customer service to both guests and teams.

Transportation: assist with ADA transportation needs for our guest on major event days

Stands & Mounds: enforce ticket checks and assist with guest needs in our seating locations

Special Assignments: work at a Q&A station answering guest questions or work one of the areas above if there are call offs.

GUEST EXPERIENCE

Supervisors

Although you are in the College Program, while at post your direct supervisor will be a Safety Patrol supervisor located in your division.

- Supervisors will be wearing a **YELLOW** hat
- Division Coordinators will be wearing a **WHITE** hat

Guest Experience College Program Event Staff are based off a tiered system.

Tier 1: All Event Days

May 8, 9, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 22, 23, & 24

Tier 2: Event Weekends

May 9, 16, 17, 22, 23, & 24

Tier 3: I500 Race Weekend Only

May 22, 23, & 24

RD Only: I500 Race Day Only

May 24

We expect students to be at all listed days in their tier, unless not scheduled or have requested off.

Students may be scheduled days outside of their Tier and may not be scheduled everyday of their Tier.

Please check your inbox for 2 DIFFERENT emails regarding schedules. 1 for Grand Prix and 1 for I500.

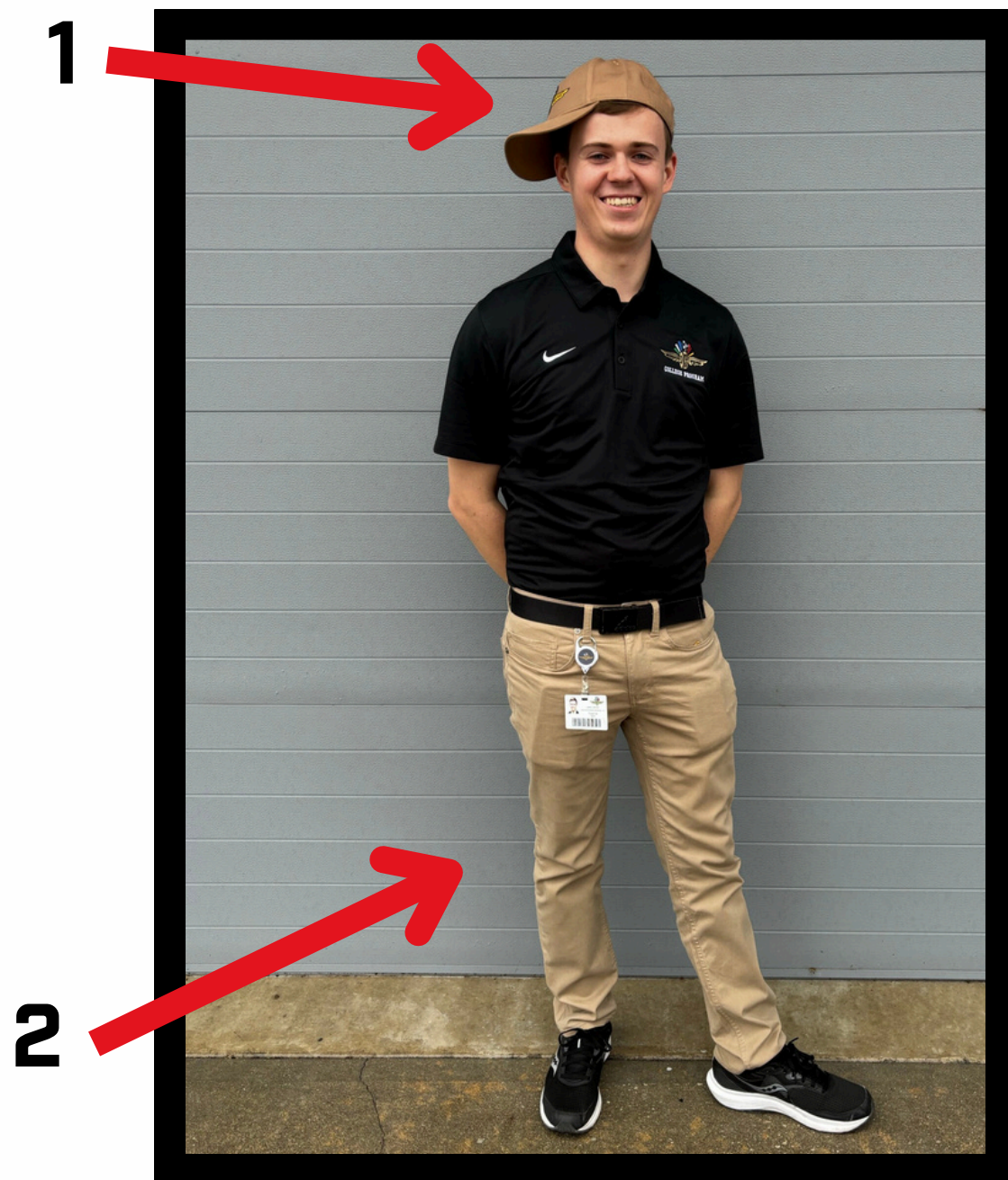

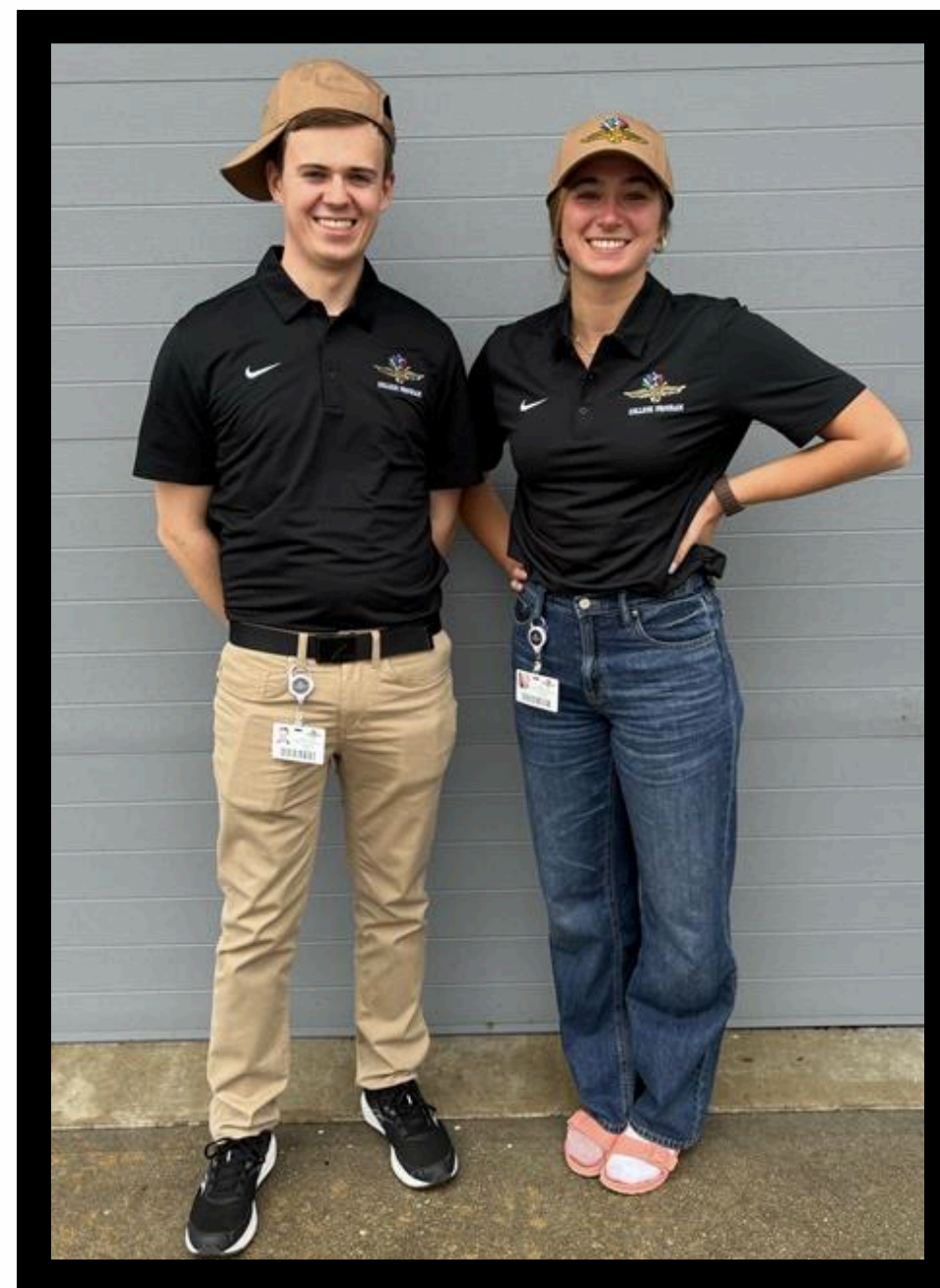

1. Please wear your hat the appropriate direction.



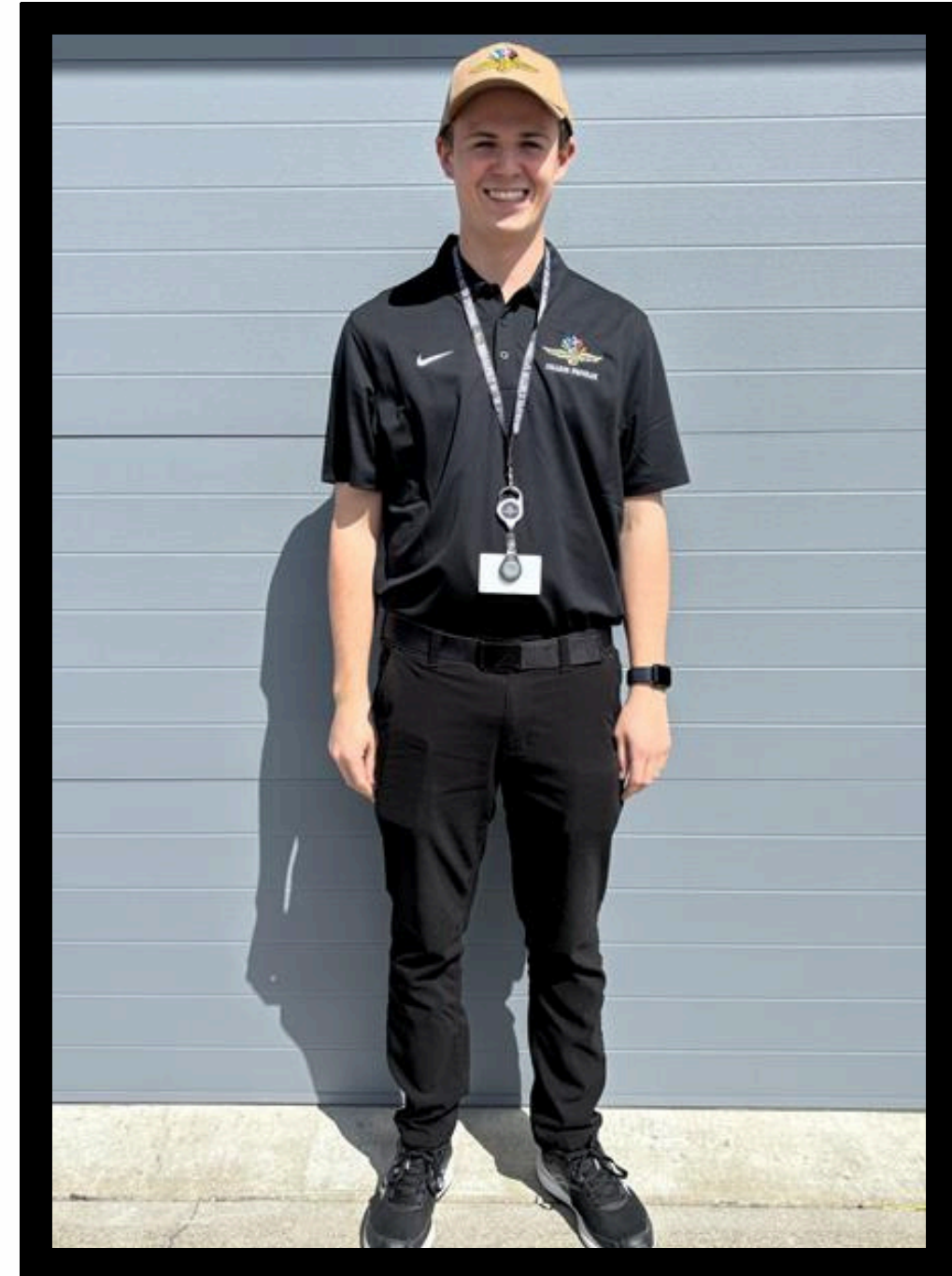
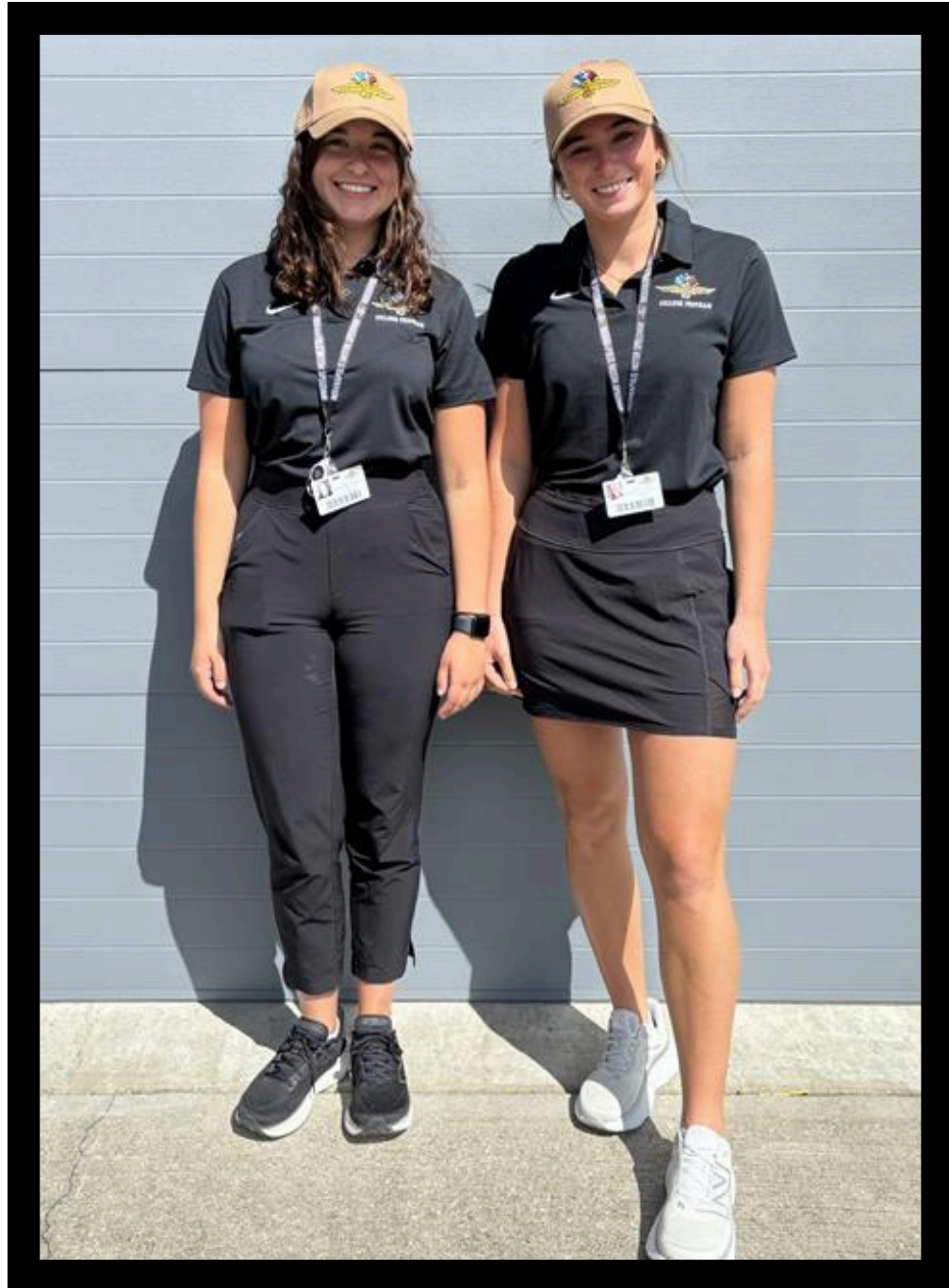

Logistics



- ***Weather***

- We're an outdoor venue; open rain or shine
- Dress appropriate for the weather
- It tends to be chilly in the mornings - if you wear a sweatshirt please be sure it is a neutral color
- Bring rain jacket, extra socks, extra bottoms for rain days

- ***Lunch & Snacks***

- Please bring lunch or money to buy food at concessions
- Pack snacks in your crossbody bag
- Water will be provided at your post

- ***ID Badge***

- Have your ID on you at all times - this is your credential
- You cannot clock-in/out without it

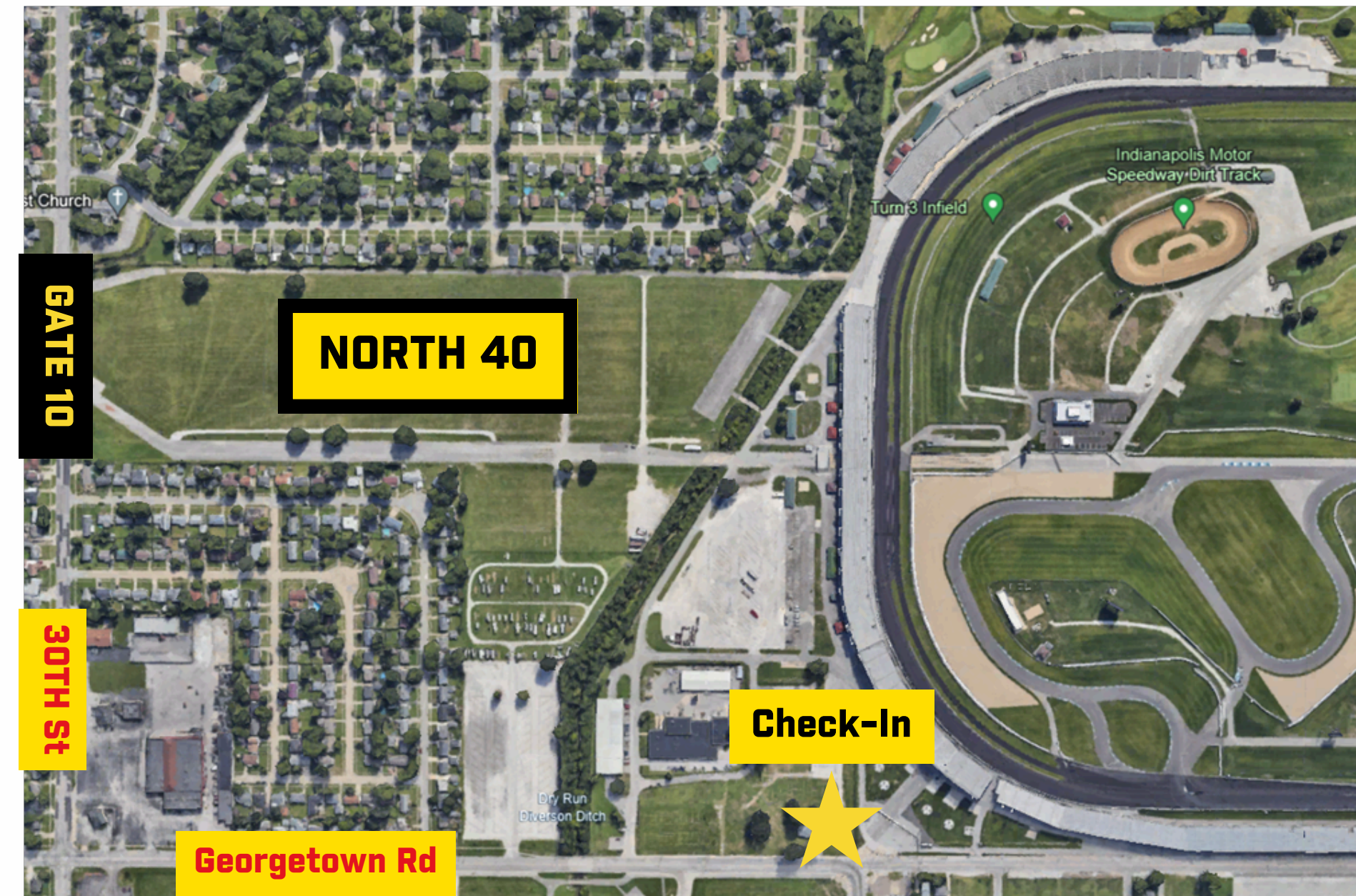
Where to Park

On event days, all employees will park on the **North End of the Facility in the North 40 (Lot 7)**, enter Gate 10 off of 30th Street.

4332 W 30th St, Indianapolis, IN 46222

We suggest entering from the WEST to turn right into the lot

Parking passes will be provided in advance.

CHECK-IN

The employee Check-In area is located at the northwest most point of the facility at the corner of 25th & Georgetown Rd. ([2515 Georgetown Rd, Speedway, IN 46224](#); look for a gray brick house and garage).

This is the location you will report to each morning to clock in and gather daily information sheets that will help you on the grounds.

EQUIPMENT PICKUP

If you are unable to attend training, all college program event staff are strongly encouraged to pick up their equipment (shirt, hat, ID badge) before the first day of work. These can be picked up from the Check-In Garage, the corner of 25th & Georgetown Rd. ([2515 Georgetown Rd, Speedway, IN 46224](#)), starting on April 27th until May 21st within the hours of 9am-4pm

If you do not pick up your equipment in advance - you will get it on your first day of work.
